Army ROTC Scholarships

- Funded by US Army Cadet Command.
- Number available: about 35 per year
- Pays for tuition, fees, \$900 for books per year; stipend of \$300/month freshman year, \$350 sophomore year, \$450 junior year, \$500 senior year. If on HOPE, ROTC scholarship will pay an amount equal to tuition and fees for room and meals.
- Eligibility: 2.5 high school GPA; minimum 920 SAT or 19 ACT; medically qualified; participation in sports and extra curricular activities; meet Army height and weight standards.
- Obligation: four years regular Army as an officer after graduation from college.
- Deadline: December 1st. Strongly suggest apply prior to November 1st.

Georgia Military Scholarships

- Funded by State of Georgia.
- Number available: 39
- Pays for all college expenses to include room, meals, tuition, books and fees; and provides monthly stipend (this is a "full ride").
- Eligibility: 3.0 high school GPA; minimum 1010 SAT or 22 ACT; medically qualified; participation in sports and extra curricular activities; meet Army height and weight standards.
- Obligation: Serve as enlisted soldier in the Guard during college, then four years in the Georgia Army National Guard as an officer after graduation from college. Must attend Army basic and advanced individual training during 1st year of college.
- Deadline: March 10th. Strongly suggest apply prior to December 1st.

NGCSU Leadership Scholarships

- Funded by various sources
- Number available: 10-30 - depends on funding available
- Pays \$550 per semester
- Eligibility: 2.5 or above high school GPA
- Obligation: participate in corps of cadets
- Deadline: March 10.

- North Georgia College & State University ROTC grant is given to each cadet who is a Georgia resident who maintains satisfactory academic performance at the end of each semester. Amount is up to \$750 per semester as determined by the Georgia Student Finance Commission.

- NGCSU is the only college campus to have a drilling Reserve detachment on campus - the Georgia Mountain Detachment.
- Army Reserve pay and benefits will total more than all the costs of attending NGCSU. In fact, the Cadet-Reservist will actually make more money than what it costs to get a bachelors degree.
- Primarily for out-of-state cadets; however, in-state cadets may participate as well
- Better than an Army ROTC Scholarship.

- Learn advanced problem-solving, decision making, effective communication skills, time and project management skills, and leadership skills that will set the student up for success in life after college.
- A *Leadership Minor* is offered for all participants.

Army ROTC Contract Pay:

- Cadets who want to commission as officers in the Army may sign a contract as early as the beginning of their sophomore year, or as late as their senior year.
- The contract is an agreement where the cadet promises to accept a commission as a second lieutenant in either the Guard, Reserves, or Regular Army upon graduation from NGCSU.
- Contract pay is \$350/month sophomore year; \$450/month junior year; \$500 per month senior year.

- For those interested in learning Arabic, Farsi, Russian, Korean or Chinese. NGCSU has a formal partnership with the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, California. Will earn associates degree in the language in addition to bachelors degree in any other discipline at NGCSU.
- Must join the US Army Reserve or Georgia Army National Guard.
- Must pass the Defense Language Aptitude Battery (DLAB).
- Pay and benefits far exceed cost of getting associates and bachelors degrees.
